8th Partners Forum for Nutrition (PFN) meeting

8th quarterly Partners Forum for Nutrition (PFN) meeting was held on 7 February 2016 at IPHN Conference Room with stakeholders and partners of NNS.

The meeting was held with a view to strengthen the collaboration among GoB-NGO working in the Nutrition field. The Chair person, Dr. Md. Moudud Hossain, Deputy Director, DGHS & Program Manager, NNS welcomed the participants and formally inaugurated the meeting. He gave thanks to all for supporting IPHN on Nutritional activities. NICC Meeting

The 12th meeting of Nutrition Implementation Coordination Committee (NICC) was held on 01 February, 2016 at IPHN Conference Room. At first, Director, IPHN and Line Director NNS & member secretary of NICC welcomed all the members and informed about the objectives of this meeting. The agendas were adoption of meeting minutes of previous meeting; progress of NNS activitie, implementation of DAAR indicators, and status update of National Vitamin-A Campaign 2015.

With reference of earlier meeting minutes, members wanted to know about job description (JD) status of District Nutrition Support Officer (DNSO). Dr. Md. Moudud Hossain, Program Manager, NNS informed that till now NNS did not get any approval from MoHFW. He assured during preparation of JD for DNSO existing JD of DNSO of UNICEF would be considered. Members asked about local training (ToT and upazila based tarining). Dr. Md. Moudud Hossain informed that NNS has received no objection from the World Bank and approval from MoHFW. He further informed, letter was issued to BRAC University and IMCI to arrange Tot on Basic Nutrition and IYCF respectively. But BRAC University informed that they are unable to arrange this training. Subsequently, IPHN sent letter to BCPS to organize Tot on SAM/CMAM. Considering the quality and volume, members voiced to send letter to Azimpur Maternity/NIPORT and Government Medical College/Child Hospital to arrange Tot on Basic Nutrition and SAM/CMAM respectively. Dr. Md. Yunus, Asst. Director & DPM, IMCI said there is no provision to record nutrition related information in the IMCI register. Dr. Md. Moudud Hossain informed that presently a template was provided to all IMCI&N corners, service providers can give tally mark & record daily information and at the end of month can generate compiled data from this template/format.

Moreover, progresses on OP level Indicators were also discussed in the meeting. Program manager also showed the coverage of training progress during FY 2014-15. He also discussed about the update of National Vitamin-A Campaign 2015 and its coverage.

Online Growth Monitoring (Shishur Bere Otha)

Growth monitoring tools have been used to assess whether a child is receiving adequate nutrition and to screen for potentially inadequate growth that might be indicative of adverse health conditions. However, in the past two years, concerns about assess the stunting and underweight, NNS/IPHN has released a new online based growth monitoring tool (GMP card) for children aged 0-59 months.

It is a registration based application where a child is entered through a profile with his/her date of birth, gender, present height, weight. After providing this information, a growth chart will be shown in the screen for the child. In the website, there are also some nutrition information and list of available locations to get GMP cards.

FSNSP Surveillance Dissemination Workshop

The National Food Security Nutritional Surveillance Project (FSNSP) has been tracking the nation's food security and nutrition situation and launching the annual report since 2011. Following previous years, the fifth annual report was launched on 27 March, 2016 at the James P Grant School of Public Health (JPGSPH), BRAC University, by the National Food Security Nutritional Surveillance Project (FSNSP), implemented jointly by the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS), Ministry of Planning, the James P Grant School of Public Health at BRAC University, and Helen Keller International – Bangladesh. Funded by the European Union, this project is being implemented countrywide since 2010 and provides seasonal data on the country as a whole and targeted to six agro ecological zones of the country.

The entire programme was divided into two sessions: Inaugural session and Technical session. Inaugural session was chaired by Md. Abdul Wazed where Mr M. A. Mannan MP, State Minister of Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Planning was present as the chief guest. Ms Kaniz Fatema, Secretary, Statistics and Informatics Division, Ministry of Planning and Mr Gonzalo Serrano, First Secretary, European Union to Bangladesh were present as special guests. Other notable guests were Professor Malabika Sarker, Director Research of the James P Grant School of Public Health, Dr Meredith Jackson deGraffenried, Country Director of Helen Keller International-Bangladesh.

Technical session was chaired by Dr. Lalita Bhattacharjee, Senior Nutritionist, FAO where Mr Mostafa Faruq Al Banna, Associate Research Director, Ministry of Food, Dr Tapan Kumar Biswas, Programme Manager, NNS, IPHN, Dr Zeba Mahmud, Country Manager, fhi 360 and Dr Dipankar Roy, Joint Director, BBS, Ministry of Planning were present as discussants.

Farmer's Nutrition Training of SPRING visit at Barisal

It was a six-day refresher training (13-18 February 2016) on Farmer Nutrition School (FNS) organized by the SPRING (Strengthening Partnerships, Results and Innovations in Nutrition Globally) project.

Building Capacity on Community Nutrition

James P Grant School of Public Health organized a workshop for building capacity of the government officials from the department of nutrition, Mozambique. 
COVERAGE OF NUTRITION SERVICES

Nutrition Services from IMCI-N corners




Figure 1: Monthly online reporting status from IMCI & Nutrition corners (Jan –March 2016)

Figure 1 shows the online reporting status of IMCI & Nutrition corners from Jan-March 2016, compiled by HMIS software. Currently almost 380 IMCI & Nutrition Corners from upazila and district levels are reporting on nutrition related indicators through online HMIS software. In February 2016, the reporting number was bit higher which was 408 IMCI & Nutrition corners.


Figure 2: Number of under 5 children reached by IMCI & Nutrition corners and PLW who have taken nutrition counseling (Jan –March 2016)

Figure 2 shows, the graphs of provided services from the IMCI & Nutrition corners from Jan-March 2016. The graph shows that IYCF practices have been increasing in the last three reporting months.

Monthly Progress Report On IMCI & Nutrition Corners

Nutrition Services from SAM units

Figure 3 shows the number of SAM facilities which provided SAM information in Jan-March 2016. These facilities have been providing reports to IPHN through e-mail or postal services. It is shown that the reporting rate, March is higher (70%) than the month of February 2016.





Figure 4: Percentage of SAM patients according to the discharged type by months (Jan –March 2016)

Figure 4 shows the status of discharged patients from different SAM units in those months. Among these, the Cure-Rate of March is higher (55%) than those in the month of February and January. On the other hand, defaulter rates are also higher than transferred or referred patients. It may be a reflection of the management of severe acute malnutrition the relevant SAM units which might have been improving with time.



3: Percentage of received report from SAM Units by months (Jan –March 2016)

Figure 5 shows, the number of community clinics sending aggregated online reports from Jan –March 2016 through HMIS data management software DHIS2. The figure shows the reporting tendency is increasing day by day. At present the reporting has increased and about to 12000 Community Clinics which are reporting through online every month.


Figure 6 shows the graphs of services provided in Community Clinics from Jan –March 2016 collected from online HMIS software. The graph shows that the IYCF practice and counseling have been increasing in the last 3 months in the Community Clinics.



Tea Garden online reporting on Nutrition

Figure 7 shows, the percentage of tea garden clnics of Kulaura upazilla, Maulavibazar who has received orientation online reporting on nutrition are sending aggregated reports from Jan – March 2016 through HMIS data management software DHIS2. The figure shows the reporting tendency is not satisfied. At present 15% of the tea garden clinics reporting out of 13 facilities who received the orientation on nutrition reporting through NNS.

Figure 8 shows the graphs of services provided from the tea garden clnics of Kularua from Jan – March 2016 collected from online HMIS software. The graph shows that the anemia rate is very high. On the other hand, Exclusive breast feeding is quite well but the under weight is also a matter of concern.



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
